Confession and Absolution Stripping of the Altar

The congregation gathers quietly as the organist plays a prelude.

*The priest enters, and **^all stand** (as able)*

^Confession and Forgiveness

Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal one:

Have mercy and hear us.

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your lovingkindness.

In your great compassion, blot out my offenses.

Wash me through and through from my wickedness.

And cleanse me from my sin.

+All kneel or sit for silent reflection and self-examination, during which, a kyrie is sung.

Most holy and merciful God:

**I confess that I have grievously sinned against you
in many ways; not only by outward transgressions,
but also by secret thoughts and desires
which I cannot fully understand,
but which are all known to you.**

**I do earnestly repent, and am heartily sorry
for these my offenses; and I beseech you
of your great goodness, to have mercy upon me;
and, for the sake of your dear Son,
Jesus Christ our Lord, to forgive my sins,
and graciously to help my infirmities. Amen.**

Our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given power to his Church to absolve all sinners who truly repent and believe in him, of his great mercy forgive you all your sins; and by his authority committed to me, I absolve you from all your sins: In the name of the Father, and of the [+]Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Stripping of the Altar

Cantor sings as the elements are borne to an altar of repose, from which tomorrow's Communion is distributed. The altar is then stripped as Psalm 22 is intoned, and the chancel darkened. Following a period of silent meditation, all leave quietly. We reassemble to pray and meditate on the Crucifixion at 7:00pm, and to rejoice in the Resurrection Sunday morning at 8:00 & 10:00 am.
